## Park Code


Please explore and enjoy the Park. To help protect the natural environment and keep the Park a special place for everyone, please follow our Park Code.

 As a natural landscape some ground may be uneven in places so please take care. Explore and play safely by following any guidance provided and being aware of the Park's natural landscape and waterways. The lakes and rivers are deep and the water is untreated. Do not swim or paddle and keep off the ice in winter.

 Dogs are very welcome to explore the Park but always keep your dog in sight and under control and do not allow your dog to approach other Park users uninvited. Always clean up after your dog and use the bins provided. Please do not leave your dog unattended in a vehicle on warm days. Please do not disturb wildlife or livestock, and prevent dogs from approaching or chasing them by using leads.

 When using disposable barbecues please raise them off the grass, but not onto park furniture. Gas barbecues are not permitted. To see the sights of Nene Park on horseback please keep to the marked horse routes. Fishing is welcomed in designated areas and at certain times of the year. For details please contact the Ferry Meadows Visitor Centre. Always respect other people's quiet enjoyment of the Park. We encourage use of the Park for organised events or outings. Please contact us first to let us assist you in making them successful and safe. Please feel free to explore the Park from dawn to dusk – but remember that overnight stays are not permitted.

 Cycling is a great way to explore the Park, but remember these are shared paths so give way to other users and adjust your speed accordingly. Where possible, cycle on the left as you would on a road and remember to use your bell when approaching other Park visitors.

 Please do not feed wildlife or livestock. Please leave all plants for others to enjoy. Let's keep the Park green – please make use of the recycling and rubbish bins around the Park.
